Holiday Trash Removal Schedule:

Rocky Mountain Sanitation recognizes six major holidays in the calendar year: New Year's Day, Memorial Day, 4th of July, Labor Day, Thanksgiving Day and Christmas Day. From the holiday to the end of the week, all Rocky Mountain Sanitation customer's trash removal day will be delayed by one day. For example, if your trash removal day were on a Tuesday and the major holiday were a Monday, your removal day would be on Wednesday. Rocky Mountain Sanitation Bulk Product Removal Service:

You just had a yard sale, but couldn't unload that old couch or mattress. What can you do? Rocky Mountain Sanitation can pick up most bulky household items. Here is a list of acceptable items that we can take and our disposal fees.

The Mesa County Landfill accepts tires and regular household garbage. The landfill will NOT accept items with the following properties: waste containing a "free liquid" or hazardous waste, appliances containing Freon or which aren't certified as "Freon Free," materials that produce large quantities of dust when disposed, auto batteries or wastes containing mercury, electronics (such as computers), and special wastes such as biomedical materials, sludge, bulk tires and asbestos.
